

Rules:

1. All radio amateurs are welcome to take part in the marathon.
2. A list of the activating special callsigns for the marathon will be published on the Hamlogs website by 30 May 2019.
3. Special stations in England and Wales will represent the 11 venues and 10 participating countries of the Cricket World Cup. In addition England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland, Jersey, Guernsey and the Isle of Man will have a number of Cricket HQ stations.
4. RSGB will welcome special stations from the 26 DXCC Countries who are Full International Cricket Council (ICC) members and the 117 DXCC countries who are Associate ICC members. Callsigns with the suffix 19CWC will be encouraged but other activating callsigns may also be used.
5. Activating stations will call "CQ CWC" on CW or "CQ Cricket World Cup" on Phone.
6. Awards will be available for numbers of QSOs with the activating special stations. A QSO with a special callsign will be valid for awards on three different modes: CW, Phone and Digital; this will apply on each band: 160m, 80m, 40m, 30m (not SSB), 20m, 17m, 15m, 12m & 10m. The maximum number of qualifying QSOs, for award purposes, with each special callsign will be 26; that is 8 SSB, 9 CW and 9 Digital.
7. All QSOs must be made between 30 May 2019 and 14 July 2019 inclusive.
8. Awards will be:
 - a. Bronze – 50 QSOs
 - b. Silver – 125 QSOs
 - c. Gold – 250 QSOs
 - d. Platinum – 500 QSOs
 - e. Worked all Cricket Grounds – at least one QSO with each of the eleven GB19 cricket ground callsigns
 - f. Worked all Teams – at least one QSO with each of the ten GB19 team callsigns
 - g. SSB Half-Century – 50 QSOs on SSB; SSB Century – 100 QSOs on SSB
 - h. Datamodes Half-Century – 50 QSOs on digital modes; Datamodes Century – 100 QSOs on digital modes
 - i. CW Half-Century – 50 QSOs on CW; CW Century – 100 QSOs on CW
9. All QSOs will be uploaded to LoTW at the end of the marathon. There will be no Paper QSL cards or eQSL cards for the special callsigns.
